CONDITIONS

All purses divided in these moneys 70, 20 and 10 per cent. All races five to enter and three to start. Entrance fee 10 per cent of purse. Entries to close at 8:00 o'clock p. m. night before race. But society reserves right to hold less number than five by reducing the purse in proportion to the number of horses entered.

Special rates are offered visitors to the Crook County Fair by the O. W. R. & N. Co. An open rate of one and one-third fare is announced from The Dalles to Bend and all stations intermediate thereto. Sales dates September 22d to 28th inclusive. Final return limit October 1st.
