Fred J. Murphy Will Run Athletic Affairs at University.

Fred J. Murphy, Yale, 1910, has been appointed football coach at Northwestern university to succeed Denis Grady. has assisted every year in the coaching at Yale, being field coach in 1911 and advisory coach since that time.
