"The most constructive piece of educational legislation enacted for a number of years is that contained in Senate bill 64, by Senator Perkins, providing for a high school tuition fund. Under the provisions of this bill every boy and girl in the state may obtain a four-year high school education free of any tuition charges," said State Superintendent of Public Instruction Churchill.



"By House bill 97, two slight changes were made in the Union High School law by Mr. Dillard. Hereafter it will require a majority of districts voting to establish a union as well as a majority of those voting in order to establish a union high school district.

"Senate Bill 11, by Mr. Dimick, provided in the original bill that the county supervisory law should be repealed. The friends of the supervisory law made such a showing that Senator Dimick consented to withdraw his bill and amend it so as to make it optional in each county. The optional bill was agreed upon by Senator Dimick and the senators who were supporting the supervisory law. It provides that the law stand as it now is, but that in any county the school directors may, by a majority petition signed by a majority of the school directors of the county, set aside the law for their particular county."

Governor Wythecombe has issued a proclamation setting aside Friday, March 12, as "Canned Salmon Day," and urging the people of the state to use as much as possible of that food on that day.


