### ACTION IN YUCATAN ASKED

Mexican Hemp Growers Call on the State Department.

Washington.—A committee of hemp growers from the state of Yucatan, Mexico, and representatives of American hemp importers laid before the state department an appeal for some action by the Washington government that would terminate the revolutionary troubles between General Alvarado, the Carranza governor of Yucatan, and an opposing faction.

The committee said the revolution which resulted in the recent blockade of the port of Progreso by Carranza threatened the destruction of a large portion of the sisal crop, from which most of the harvest binding twine used in the United States is made.

### Carranza is Turning Property to Gold.

Washington.—Circumstantial stories that General Venustiano Carranza is turning all his property in Mexico into gold, preparatory to fleeing the country, were denied by the constitutionalist junta here. Sales of Carranza's property, the junta declared, were for the purpose of replenishing his war chest in preparation for a general campaign against Villa.

### Priests Held by Mexicans Released.

Washington.—Vicar General Parcedes and priests, taken from Mexico City by General Obregon when he evacuated the capital recently, have arrived at Vera Cruz, state department dispatches say, and General Carranza has ordered their release.

### Villa Apologizes.

Washington.—Representatives of General Francisco Villa have formally apologized to the United States for the murder by Zapatistas recently of John B. McManus, an American of Chicago.

### Ordinance Number 220

An ordinance entitled an Ordinance to regulate the use of stoves for heating water, rendering lard and tallow, within the fire limits in the City of Prineville, Oregon, defining what shall constitute violations hereof, and providing a punishment therefor.

The people of the City of Prineville, Oregon, do ordain as follows: Section 1. That from and after the taking effect of this ordinance, all stoves or other heating apparatus, within the fire limits, which are or shall be used for the purpose of heating water, rendering lard, tallow or other fatty substances, and situated in the rear rooms or other remote place of any business building, and not in the immediate personal view and control of the proprietor or his employees, while fire is therein, shall be placed upon a platform of brick, stone, cement or gravel at least four inches thick, and said platform shall not be less than five feet square, at the outer edge of said platform there shall be built thereon a substantial wall of brick, stone or cement to a height equal to the height of fire box of said stove or heating plant, or in lieu thereof, a sheet iron or sheet steel box, of equal height, and whether built of brick, stone, cement or sheet steel or sheet iron, if desired, a sheet iron, or sheet steel door may be placed in one side of said wall, for the convenient use of fuel, or wood in said stove or stoves.

Section 2. That any person or persons who shall violate any of the terms and conditions of this ordinance, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply herewith, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction to the recorder's court of the City of Prineville, Oregon, shall be fined not less than ten dollars, and not more than one hundred dollars, and pay the costs of prosecution, and in default of the payment of such fine and cost, shall be confined to the city jail one day for each two dollars of such fine and cost not to exceed thirty days.

Section 3. Owing to the fact that there are no ordinances governing the use of such stoves in such places, and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City of Prineville and its inhabitants, and on account thereof an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall therefore take effect from and after its approval by the mayor of said city.

Section 4. Passed by the city council this 2nd day of March, 1915, after the third reading.
