OREGON NEWS NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

Events Occurring Throughout
the State During the Past
Week.

Cut in Rates is Sought.

Salem.—Negotiations were started by the state railroad commission with the Spokane, Portland & Seattle railroad company to obtain relief from what are termed excessive fares for residents of the section beyond Linton, on the line of the United Railways. Numerous protests have been received by the commission since the service over the United Railways from Portland to Linton was stopped as a result of the county court compelling the company to move its tracks from the county thoroughfare.

As a result of that order, persons living beyond Linton travel over the steam railroad to that place and pay additional fares over the United Railways to their destination. Under the law joint rates must be reasonable.

West Wins in Copperfield Case.

Baker.—Ex-Governor West won in the suit brought in circuit court here against him by William Wiegand, Copperfield saloonkeeper, for damages alleged to have been caused by the removal of liquor and saloon fixtures from his saloon, when Governor West declared martial law in Copperfield, after Fern Hobbs' visit on January 2, 1914.

The result means that the other damage suits against the former governor, in which Stewart and Warner are suing for the same amount as Wiegand, will not be tried.

Children Burned to Death.

Hood River.—While their father worked in the barn nearby, Ruth and Violet Robertson, daughters of Robert Robertson, were burned to death by fire which destroyed their home, near this city.

Ruth was 7 years old and Violet was 14 years. Indications are that the children never left their bed, but were smothered and burned without a chance to save themselves. Their charred bodies were found within the twisted and blackened frame of their iron bed.

PLAN TO LOAN ROAD MONEY

Proposed Use of Forest Reserve Receipts is Outlined.

Albany.—How Oregon counties may secure money for road building without issuance of bonds or the payment of interest has been explained to the Albany commercial club by representatives of the United States forest service. The Albany club is taking steps to interest other commercial clubs of the state and the county courts in the project.

Under present laws, 35 per cent of the amounts received from the sale of timber and lands in the forest reserves and also from rentals go to the counties in which the timber is situated for improvement of roads and schools. The new plan contemplates loans by the government to such counties for road building, the loans to be repaid from future sales. Thus the people would be receiving immediate benefits from the big timbered areas which may not be sold for years.

The plan was outlined to the Albany commercial club by Charles H. Flory, of Portland, assistant district forester. The club passed a resolution favoring the plan and has decided to inaugurate a campaign to interest the commercial clubs of the state and the county courts also in a movement favoring the enactment of the plan into law by congress. The Oregon delegation in congress especially will be appealed to in the matter.

Will Build New Wing at Asylum.

Salem.—Bids for the construction of a \$100,000 wing for the eastern Oregon insane asylum will be called for on April 30, and the state board of control will meet and award the contract on May 20, according to an announcement made by State Architect W. C. Knighton.

He also stated that the \$100,000 administration building for the University of Oregon would be completed by June 15, and that the \$62,000 armory under construction in that city would be finished some time in July.
