said pension and are now unclaimed in Clerk's office.

The County of Crook agrees to appropriate the sum of \$75 to Tillman Reuter for the purpose of placing an agricultural exhibit from Crook and Jefferson counties at the San Francisco fair, providing that Jefferson county shall appropriate an equal amount.

Petition presented by David Patterson asking for indemnity in the sum of \$75 for three tubercular cattle slaughtered under the law of 1913. Order made setting the 7th day of July, 1915 at the hour of 10, A. M. in the County Court room in the court house in Prineville, Oregon as the time and place for hearing of said claim.

The bonds as road supervisors of Allen Willcoxon of District No. 25, and Charles Hindman of District No. 5 each in the sum of \$500, received and approved.

In the matter of county roads. Hearings on the S. J. Pierce and S. V. Hardin No. 2 road continued until first day of July term.

M. M. Whittemore county road; petition and other papers presented Continued until first day of July term.

Silver Lake Stage road; County agrees to take steps to legalize new road as asked for and to vacate certain portions of the old road whenever a new road is constructed satisfactory to Commissioner Overturf.

Commissioner Blanchard appointed to take all necessary steps in furnishing a proper office in the court house for the Circuit Judge.

Commissioner Overturf appointed to investigate and repair the lower bridge at Laidlaw.

Order an appropriation out of the general fund for the Redmond Potato Show and the Sisters Fair Association, each in the sum of \$200. Warrants of said appropriation not to be drawn until after September 1, 1915.

County Clerk presented the list of warrants which have been issued over seven years. Clerk instructed to publish same.

Order made discontinuing the services of J. E. Adamson as janitor of the court house on May 15th, 1915 and appointing Henry Clow as janitor of said building and grounds at a salary of \$75 per month.

Order made directing warrants to be issued to J. F. Blanchard and H. J. Overturf, each in the sum of \$500 to be used by them as a revolving fund on road work in their respective districts. Said warrants to be issued by the Clerk when said Commissioners shall each have presented a good and sufficient bond in the sum of \$1000; said bonds to be approved by Judge Springer.

In their attestation of the boundaries of road districts. Due to the change in the boundary of the county, the following changes are made in the boundaries and numbers of certain road districts in Crook County:

Road district No. 1 is the incorporated Town of Prineville; road district No. 3 is the incorporated town of Bend.

Sisters district, No. 5; Commencing at the SE corner of section 36, T. 15s. R. 10e., thence north 2 miles, thence east three miles, thence north 6 miles thence west 1 mile, thence north about 1 1/2 miles to Squaw Creek thence northeasterly along said Squaw creek to line between townships 15 and 16, thence east to point of beginning.

Montgomery precinct No. 6. Beginning at the SE corner of section 6 T. 15 S. R. 16 E., thence north to the city limits of the Town of Prineville, thence north and west along said city limits to its intersection with Ochoco Creek, thence along Ochoco Creek northwesterly to its intersection with Crooked river; thence northwest along Crooked river to its intersection with the range line between ranges 14 and 15 E., thence north to township line between 13 and 14 thence west to intersection of township line with Crooked

River, thence southeast along Crooked River to its intersection with the range line between 13 and 14, thence south to the S. W. corner of section 6, T. 15 S. R. 14 E., thence east to the point of beginning.

McKay district No. 7. Beginning at the SE corner of section 32 T. 14 S. R. 16 E., thence north three miles, thence east 2 miles, thence north 2 miles, thence east 4 miles, thence north 5 miles, thence east 5 miles north 8 miles, thence west 11 miles, thence south 6 miles, thence west 8 miles thence south about 9 1/2 miles to Crooked river thence southeast along Crooked river to the mouth of Ochoco Creek, thence SE along Ochoco Creek to its intersection with the city limits of the Town of Prineville, thence N. E. and S. along said city limits to their intersection with the township line between 14 and 15 S., thence east to the point of beginning.

Lower Bridge district No. 8. Beginning at the southeast corner of section 35 T. 14 S. R. 12 E., thence north 2 miles, thence east 1 mile, thence north 2 miles, thence west 1 mile, thence north 1 mile thence 1 1/2 miles to the intersection with the Deschutes river, thence north along Deschutes river to its intersection with township line between 13 and 14 south, thence west along township line to its intersection with the west line of section 16 T. 14 S. R. 11 E., thence east 2 miles, thence south 2 miles, thence east 7 miles to place of beginning.

Mill Creek district No. 14. Beginning at the S. E. corner of section 36 T. 15 S. R. 19 E., thence north 5 miles, thence west 7 miles, thence north 19 miles, thence west 4 miles, thence south 8 miles, thence west 5 miles, thence south 11 miles, thence east 2 miles, thence south 1 mile, thence east 4 miles; thence south 1 mile; thence east 2 miles; thence south 3 miles; thence east 8 miles to the point of beginning.

Howard district No. 15. Beginning at the southeast corner of section 1 T. 15 S. R. 19 E., thence north 7 miles, thence east 2 miles, thence north 3 miles, thence west 2 miles, thence north 9 miles, thence west 7 miles, thence south 19 miles, thence east 7 miles to point of beginning.

Summit district No. 16. Beginning at southeast corner of section 24 T. 15 S. R. 25 E., thence north 4 miles, thence west 12 miles, thence north 6 miles, thence west 6 miles, thence north 3 miles, thence west 6 miles thence south 3 miles, thence west 2 miles, thence south 10 miles, thence east 15 miles, thence north 6 miles, thence east 15 miles to point of beginning.

Beaver Creek district No. 20. Beginning at southeast corner of section 36 T. 17 S. R. 25 E., thence north 14 miles, thence west 15 miles, thence north 6 miles, thence west 6 miles, thence south 6 miles, thence east 3 miles, thence south 14 miles, thence east 18 miles to point of beginning.

Hillman district No. 34. Beginning at south east corner of section 25 T. 14 S. R. 13 E., thence north about 3 miles to Crooked River, thence north east along Crooked River to township line between 13 and 14 south, thence west along township line to Deschutes River, thence south along Deschutes River to south line of section 3, T. 14 S. R. 12 E., thence east to south east corner of section 2, T. 14 S. R. 12 E., thence south 1 mile, thence east 1 mile thence south 2 miles thence west 1 mile, thence south 1 mile, thence east 7 miles to point of beginning.

Cline Falls district No. 35 changed to No. 9. Hat Rock district No. 36 changed to No. 10. Alfalfa district No. 40 changed to No. 23. Imperial district No. 46 changed to No. 26. Millican district No. 41 changed to No. 29. Ireland district No. 47 changed to No. 30.
