

MEXICANS FIRE ON U. S. BORDER PATROL

Brownsville, Texas.—A detachment of the United States cavalry patrol was fired on from the Mexican side of the Rio Grande near Progresso. The cavalrymen returned the fire.

Corporal Wilman is reported to have been killed and Lieutenant Roy O. Henry and Private Jackson wounded.

Rangers and peace officers are disarming all Mexicans outside of the larger towns throughout the Brownsville section.

Firearms discovered in the possession of Mexicans in rural communities of this section is practically equivalent to a death warrant unless that Mexican is well known to Americans as being peaceful. Even with such a record, firearms are confiscated and a warning given not to obtain any more.

Authorities here received reports that 25 horses, including some recognized as animals stolen by bandits to recent raids on the Texas side, were delivered in Matamoras, the Mexican town opposite here held by Carranza troops.

CAPERTON IS IN POWER

Given Full Authority to Suppress All Disorders in Haiti,

Washington.—Admiral Caperton, in charge of American forces in Haiti, has been clothed with full power to curb malcontents who rebel against the newly elected president of the island and marines will be kept in Haiti for months if necessary to bring about complete order there.

It is understood that France, whose financial interest in Haiti is large, is

in sympathy with the steps taken by this government to check the revolution.

That the revolution has left hundreds of natives in want was reported to the Red Cross by Admiral Caperton. In response to an urgent request by the American commander, the Red Cross sent \$1000 through the war department to relieve famine.

VILLA CIRCULATES APPEAL FOR PEACE

Washington.—Acceptances of the Pan-American plan for restoring peace and government in Mexico are expected by officials here in a few days from General Villa, General Anaya and other leaders in northern Mexico.

It became known that under direction of General Villa and his lieutenants, copies of the peace appeal from the United States and the Latin-American diplomats had been printed at Juarez and Chihuahua for distribution throughout every section of Mexico that can be reached.
