Germany and England have both placed orders for munitions with Swiss factories

The British reinforced their Gallipoli army during the past week and made slight advance inland from Sulva bay

Italian troops captured an important Austrian redoubt near Monte Magnio in the Trentino region, General Cadorna reported.

Cotton was officially declared absolute contraband of war by the British government.

The Russian armies are continuing their retreat under the persistent pressure of the Austro-Germans. The report from German army headquarters told of the capture of Bielsk on the Brest-Litovsk-Binlystok line, by General von Gallwitz' troops, and the driving of the Russfans south of Bielak over the Hiala River. The Russians made a stand before the advance of the army of Prince Leopold of Bavaria, but broke under the German attack and continued their retreat, Berlin announces.
