

September Term
Of County Court

Be it remembered a regular term of the County Court of Crook County State of Oregon was begun and held at the Courthouse in Prineville, Oregon on Wednesday the first day of September, 1915, the same being the first Wednesday in said month and the time fixed by law for holding a regular term of said court; when were present at the hour of 10 o'clock A. M. the following officers:

G. Springer, Judge, presiding, J. F. Blanchard, Commissioner, H. J. Overturf, Commissioner, Warren Brown, Clerk, E. B. Knox, Sheriff.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:—

In the matter of County Roads: Hearing of O. F. Wallenberg road continued until next regular term of court for personal investigation by Commissioners of this Court.

Hearing held on Surveyor's report on the C. H. Dealy road. Oral objection and arguments presented. Hearing continued for further investigation until next regular term of court.

Petition presented for change in the Irwin D. Basey Road. Bond approved in the sum of \$200. Affidavits of posting notice and opinion of Dist. Atty. filed. Viewers ordered out on the day of 1915.

Viewers' report on the John French road for first time

Viewers' report on the M. M. Whitmore Road read for the first time.

Resmond-Powell Butte Road. Order Allen Wilcoxen to supervise the expenditure of a sum not to exceed \$150 on this road; order warrant to him in this amount to be accounted for by proper vouchers to this Court.

J. W. McCaffery Road. Order Allen Wilcoxen to build a bridge over the main canal and move the head gate as soon as said road is put in a condition satisfactory to Allen Wilcoxen.

Hearing held on Surveyor's report on S. J. Pierce Road; and court satisfied proper notice had been given to all property owners; County Surveyor ordered to make final survey and report.

Petition presented by Thomas Anderson Camp U. S. W. V. asking for proper meeting place in County Courthouse under Chapt. 46, 1913, General Laws of Oregon. Order granting use of circuit court room, when not otherwise in use for said purpose.

Order granting franchise to Squaw Creek Irrigation Company to construct Telephone and Telegraph lines along County Roads in Crook County.

Order H. A. Kelly to complete the foundations and erect the Beaver Creek Bridge at Paulina.

Order appointing J. F. Blanchard as delegate for Crook County to the Conference called by Governor of Oregon to consider the Oregon-California Land Grant case. County to pay necessary traveling expenses.

Petition of Mary H. Goodwin for widow's pension denied for want of jurisdiction.

Court convened this second day of September, 1915, at the hour of nine A. M. Present:

J. F. Blanchard, Commissioner, presiding; H. J. Overturf, Warren Brown, Clerk, and E. B. Knox, Sheriff.

In the Matter of County Roads: Resolution adopted directing Surveyor to make preliminary survey of the Geo. A. Jones road.

Resolution adopted directing the surveyor to make a preliminary survey of the extension of the L. C. Young Road.

Viewers' report on the John French Road read a second time; Clerk instructed to issue proper order opening said road a public highway whenever funds are available.

Viewers' report on M. M. Whitmore road read a second time; Clerk instructed to issue proper order opening said road as a public highway whenever funds are available.

Hearing held on Tumalo Project No. 1 Road. No objections appearing to establishment of said road; and due notice to property owners appearing to satisfaction of Court; County Surveyor ordered to make

final survey and report. According to an agreement made in June 1914, between R. H. Bayley as commissioner and C. S. Hudson in the Matter of the Tumalo Project No. 1 Road, C. S. Hudson allowed damages in the sum of \$260, and warrant ordered for same.

Hearing on S. V. Hardin No. 2 Road continued until first day for regular November term of Court.

Semi-annual report of County Clerk to June 30, 1915, accepted.

District Attorney ordered to file complaint against the Pioneer Telephone and Telegraph Company and the Pilot Butte Telephone Company with the Public Service Commission at Salem in regard to the improvement of Telephone connections in Crook County.

On petition of the Redmond and Bend Commercial Clubs, order warrant drawn in the sum of \$100 in favor of A. E. Lovett, County Agriculturist, to be used for carrying on demonstration work on the High Desert in Crook County. A. E. Lovett to render an itemized account with proper vouchers to this Court for the expenditure of said amount.

Statement of County Clerk for bounties paid during months of July and August, 1915, accepted.

Report of R. H. Bayley as commissioner received and continued for further investigation.

Report of Mrs. N. G. Davis of expenditures for Mrs. Prisco received and approved. Order cancelled warrant No. 1685, Class to Mrs. N. G. Davis in the sum of \$10.

Resignation of Warren McConnell as Justice of the Peace for Imperial Precinct accepted. Order his bondsman released.

On petition of residents of Redmond, order C. W. Ehret appointed as constable of Redmond precinct.

Order warrants drawn in favor of J. E. Myers, County Superintendent for the following appropriations,

- Library Fund \$250. 00
- School Exhibit at Crook County Fair \$230. 00
- Teacher's Institute \$150. 00

Petition presented by J. J. Ellinger for indemnity for tubercular cattle slaughter in the sum of \$25. Order setting Wednesday the 3rd day of November, 1915 at the hour of 10 o'clock A. M. in the county court room as time of hearing on said claim.

Petition of residents of Imperial District for relief referred to Com. Overturf with power to act.
