

Dispatches from Nish estimate the Teutoaic losses in the Serbian campaign as 25,000 killed and 60,000 wounded during the past week. Great Britain's declaration of war

on Balgaria has been followed by a declaration of a blockade of the Bulgarian ports on the Aegean Sea,

Roumania has joined Greece in declining to enter the war by announcing officially that the Roumanian government intends to observe strict neutrality.

Along the western front there has been heavy fighting in the Artois, Champagne and Vosges regions. Attacks were made by both sides, but the gains and losses are described as being of minor importance. Italy has declared war against Bul-

thay has declared war against Buigaria, but the question whether she will send troops to join the British and French forces in Serbia remains as obscure as the results of the fighting raging on Serbia's eastern frontier.

The Austro-German armies which occupied Belgrade appear to have advanced more than 15 miles south of the city, but the outcome of the fighting between Bulgarians and Serbians along the important Saloniki-Nish railway cannot be summed up so easily. Both Athens and Paris maintain

that French troops have occupied Strumnitza in southwestern Bulgaria, but there are available no official reports relating to the struggle in this quarter and none is expected until the fighting reaches a more conclusive stage.

After having driven the German merchantmen from the Baltic sea, the British submarines have sunk one, and probably two, German torpedo craft—one reported to be a torpedo boat destroyer and the other a torpedo boat—which with other warships had come out to convoy steamers.

The K-7, one of the four submarines which made the trip from San Francisco to Honolulu under their own power, completed the 2100-mile journey without a stop.

Lieutenant-Commander Lauterbach, of the German cruiser Emden when she was destroyed, has escaped from India, crossed the United States and is back in Germany.

Six warrant officers from the interned German cruiser Kronprinz Wilheim have escaped and are believed to have gone to sea in a 50-foot yacht they purchased. The federal government is searching for them.

BRIEF WAR NEWS

Figures show an average loss to the British army of nearly 2500 men a day. A squadron of the allies bombarded the Bulgarian port of Dedeaghatch, in the Aegean sea.

Italy is still hammering away at the Austrian front, which is shaken but unbroken. It is expected in London that the Italian offensive will at least prevent the Austrians from reinforcing their Balkan army.

Greece has declined, for the present, the allies' offer to her of Cyprus and other concessions, territorial and financial, in return for military aid to assist in meeting the Bulgarian and Austro-German attack against Serbia. The Italian advance in Tyrol and Trentino is being carried out in conformity with the pian to relieve the pressure on Serbia. New successes are reported, and it is said that a general forward movement is under way.


Field Marshal von Hindenburg, in his attack on Riga, has reached Olal, which is kalf way between Riga and Mitau, and only a dozen miles southwest of the Baltic port. The German offensive extends along a front of about 70 miles.

The Rome newspapers express great indignation at the bombardment of the famous Scalzi church in Venice and the destruction of the Tiepolo frescoes. The news of the bomb attack on Venice has stirred the people of Rome to an extraordinary degree.

Russia, by her stubborn defense of Riga and Dvinsk and her continued offensive in Galicia, is keeping her opponents engaged busily along the whole eastern front. In the west, there is evidence that the entente allies are again preparing for an offensive which may prevent the Germans from diverting any of their forces there.



Gernert, stock selling agents, and Oscar Campbell, a director, were sentenced to serve four months in the county jall.
