provided they want the work. The expenditure of this money and the development of these lands will immediately bring prosperity to the whole community, to the individual in giving him steady employment and to the city by bringing business to every house within its confines.

The lands that are to be irrigated are for the greater part, at least, now producing about 10 bushels of rye per acre every other year. Under irrigation they are admittedly among the best alfalfa lands in the state. From three to five tons per acre each year is a conservative estimate of the amount of first quality that these lands can produce.

Of course there will be years when water will be scarce, but any one who has lived in the Ochoco Valley for any length of time, knows that if the waters of winter and early spring are conserved, there will always be enough to irrigate one good crop, and usually enough for the entire season.

I maintain that the creation of the Ochoco Irrigation District and its development is worth more to the community than any other one thing, a railroad not excepted, and I further maintain that there is no other one thing that will come as near bringing a railroad as the formation and development of this irrigation project.
