the Jack-rabbit bounty proposition, will kindly ask you to allow me to present some of the facts on the other side of the question.

Now you state that the county had paid out something over Forty thousand dollars and that the rabbits were not all dead yet. This is true, but a sufficient number of them are dead from the effects of the law, that we have heard no complaint of them having eaten up all the crops. Up to 1915, or before, the rabbits were hunted, it was a common thing to hear a homesteader remark that rabbits destroyed all my garden, my alfalfa and eighty acres of grain, etc. Last year not a single complaint was heard. The best gardens, the heaviest yield of grain and alfalfa was raised last year that Harney Valley ever produced before. Mr. Weittenhiller alone raised one fifth as much grain last year as the whole of Harney Valley produced the year before. Think what this amounts to for Harney Valley's future.

**Are Your Hens Laying Eggs or are they Non-Producing For the Lack of Proper Winter Foods and Attention?**

In winter a regular system of feeding should be adopted and steadily adhered to throughout.
