Are Your Hens Laying Eggs or are they Non-Producing For the Lack of Proper Winter Foods and Attention?

HOW TO GET MORE EGGS

In winter a regular system of feeding should be adopted and steadily adhered to throughout. Give your hens a comfortable shelter with plenty of light; keep dry, clean and well ventilated, but avoid draughts of cold air. Feed regularly a variety of good clean food. Table scraps thickened with bran, boiled together, are also very good in winter, to which add a teaspoonfull of DR. HESS' POULTRY PAN-A-CE-A as directed. Give in a mash of wheat, bran and shorts which should constitute the morning feed. In winter give warm. Small grain should be thrown among chaff, which will compel the fowls to exercise.
