JUDGE BRINK TO BE CANDIDATE FOR CIRCUIT COURT BENCH.

Verifying our political forecast of two weeks ago, and upon the solicitation of his numerous friends, Judge M. E. Brink, of this city has consented to be a candidate for the Republican nomination for Circuit Judge of the eighteenth judicial district, comprising Crook and Jefferson counties.

Judge Brink needs no introduction to the people of this district. He has practiced law successfully in Crook County for more than 26 years, and is popularly known as the "Dean of the Central Oregon Bar." In 1894 he was made county judge of Crook County, party politics being laid aside and voters of all parties uniting in his election. Although at the time, the youngest county judge in the State, his administration of the county affairs is still referred to as a period of efficiency and economy.

When the eighteenth judicial district was created last Spring, Judge Brink received one of the strongest endorsements for the judgeship ever presented in this State.

In case of his nomination and election the people of this district will be assured an able and economical administration of the law.
