### TO POISON RABBITS.

Mix a tablespoonful of gloss starch in a half teacup of cold water, and stir into one half pint of boiling water to make a thin, clear, mucilage. Mix one ounce of powdered strychnine with one ounce of powdered bicarbonate of soda, and stir with the starch to a smooth creamy mass, free of lumps. Stir one forth of a pint of heavy corn syrup and a tablespoonful of glycerine, and finally a scant teaspoonful of saccharine. Appy to 20 quarts of oats, and mix thoroughly
