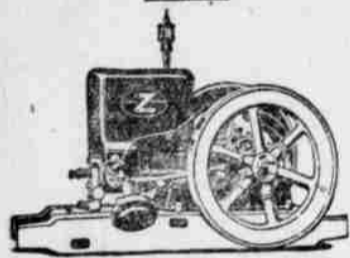

### FLAG PRESENTED TO THE CIRCUIT COURT

On Thursday afternoon, May 25th, a beautiful silk American Flag was presented to the Circuit Court of Crook County, by the Sons of the American Revolution represented by Lake M. Bechtell. Four foreign-born citizens had just been admitted to citizenship and the flag was presented to be used in the procedure of naturalization. A large crowd packed the circuit court room and the students of the Crook County High School attended in a body and sang America and the Star Spangled Banner during the ceremonies.

Lake M. Bechtell presented the flag in a speech descriptive of the purpose of the ceremony. Jay H. Upton addressed the court as a representative of the Veteran Soldiers. Geo. H. Ramsey spoke on American Citizenship and N. G. Wallace spoke for the Bar.

Judge T. E. J. Duffy accepted the flag in an instructive and patriotic speech addressed principally to the new citizens.

The ceremony was an impressive one, and no less than 200 people who were present greatly enjoyed the proceedings.

### FLAG DAY HAS BEEN SET FOR JUNE 14TH

Whereas, June 14th, 1916, is the 139th anniversary of the adoption of the Stars and Stripes; and

Whereas, Organizations of a patriotic nature in Oregon are desirous that special emphasis be placed upon this day and its meaning; and

Whereas, This generation has seen no time when loyalty and patriotism are more required than now, or when the encouragement of these vital national virtues is more appropriate;

Now, Therefore, I do hereby proclaim Wednesday, June 14th, as FLAG DAY throughout the State of Oregon, and I earnestly urge that the day be devoted to exercises indicative of and conducive to loyalty to the Flag; that in homes, schools, churches and business establishments the occasion be fittingly observed; that the Flag be displayed from public buildings, schools, homes and places of business, and the entire commonwealth, at this critical period of international unrest, unite in honoring the Flag of the United States of America and in pledging renewed and vigorous loyalty to it and the principles of liberty it represents.

In Testimony Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Oregon to be hereunto affixed this third day of June 1916.

Reporter, has held that an appearance by the district attorney at the time of taking the testimony is not sufficient appearance within the provisions of the statutes both defining appearance and the duties of the district attorney.

In suits for divorce the law requires that the district attorney appear and make a defense where the defendant has not answered but is in default, and it has been the practice throughout the state for the district attorney to appear at

the time of taking testimony in divorce suits and cross-examine the witnesses in an effort to learn whether there has been any collusion between the parties or an unlawful agreement whereby one party may be permitted illegally to secure a divorce, but hereafter District Attorney Wirtz says he will make the state a party directly by filing a pleading in each cause in addition to appearing at the trial of all divorce cases, as has been the practice.
