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## ROUMANIANS DRIVEN BACK BY TEUTONS

Berlin,-Teuton troops under General Von Falkenhayn, former chief of the general staff, have won their first important victory over the Roumanians in Transylvania.

Using the same encircling tactics that caused the rot of the Russo-Roumanians in Dobrud a, von Falkenhayn has won a four-day sattle in the region of Hermannstadt, former capital of Transylvania. Part of the Roumanian force that pressed northward and occupled the city has been driven southward in disorder. The Austro-Germans are sweeping eastward, and it is believed that Hermannstadt already has been evacuated by the Roumanians. Falkenhayn first struck a quick

blow with his left wing, recapturing the famous Red Tower pass, near the Transylvanian frontier. Having blocked the enemy's retreat on the railway leading through the Red Tower, he moved northward, rolling up the Roumanian left wing and sending part of the Roumanian first army in hurried

The second Roumanian army attempted to stiffen the retreating enemy forces, but was thrown back by the Bavarians. A large number of prisoners and much booty has been

ZEPPELIN IS DESTROYED

Crew Burns to Death When Airship is Shot Down.

London.-Ten Zeppelins took part in another raid over England Saturday night. Two of them attempted to attack London. One was driven away and the other was destroyed.

Except for part of the envelope, there was hardly a vestige recognizable as part of the huge airship, which was brought down near Potter's Bar. than the one previously destroyed. which, like it, fortunately fell in an open field.

The members of the crew were incinerated and the bodies scattered over the field on which the airship er's cottage.
