The Oregon Voter, which has undertaken for itself the task of correcting many of the evils political in this state, and which has actually accomplished some good things, has an editorial in its last issue under the caption "Freckled Politics," in which our newly elected representative is accused of being an honest man and a number of other things, equally interesting, are mentioned. Of the 90 members, only 44 represent one party each. They include 36 republicans and 8 democrats. Then, there are two independents.
