FAILED TO REGISTER: NOW IN FEDERAL JAIL

PERRY MORGAN PLACED UNDER ARREST BY SHERIFF KNOX

FAILED TO GIVE \$1000 BOND

Waived Examination and Bond War

Fixed by United States Commissioner Bechtell

Perry Morgan was placed under arrest the last of the week by Sheriff Knox on a charge of failing to register on June 5.

He waived preliminary hearing on Saturday when brought before United States Commissioner Lake M. Bechtell, and his bond was fixed at \$1000.00, in default of which he was held by Sheriff Knox until the following day, when a deputy United States Marshal came from Portland and returned with him.

Morgan made no excuse for his failure to obey the order of the war department, evidently failing to realize that he would be apprehended so readily.

Sheriff Knox has investigated every case that he has been able to find where there has been any suspicion of a failure to register, and this is the first case that he has

He has not been informed about the disposition that has been made of Morgan's case by the federal authorities.
