FOREST SERVICE BUSY ARRANGING PLANS

ELEVEN MEETINGS HELD WITH USERS OF RANGE RECENTLY

PRINEVILLE - MITCHELL ROAD

Change of Entrance Date in Reserve For Good of Range Users Themselves

March has been a busy month for both the office and field forces. Since March 3rd, 11 livestock association meetings have been held with users of the Ochoco Forest. At every meeting keen interest has been shown, and while in a few cases stockmen have disagreed with ideas advanced by the Forest Service, as a rule the suggestions made and plans proposed have met with little opposition. We are looking forward to pleasant relations with the stockmen in working out range problems which are of vital interest to both the users of the range and the Government.

One of the points of major importance is the establishment of a June 1 season for all cattle instead of allowing a percentage of them to go onto the range by April 15 as has been done in years past. The Supervisor's office has authority to permit stock to enter 15 days in advance of the opening date, and it will probably be advisable to exercise the authority given. By a later entrance date, the range will not suffer from trampling by stock when the ground is wet, and the grass only started in many localities. The later season will also enable the Forest Service to care for much more stock than could formerly be permitted. The local office will do its utmost to care for as many head of stock as the range will stand, and it is believed that the total increase will be more than 2000 head for this Forest.

Ranger E. W. Donnelly, District Ranger for the Snow Mt. District, is spending a few days at the Prineville office assisting Grazing Examiner D. C. Ingram and the Supervisor work out allotment boundaries, etc. for range in his district for the coming grazing season.

Work on the new Forest Service telephone line from Prineville easterly to Ochoco Ranger Station will be commenced at an early date, probably about April 1.

Encouraging correspondence has been received from the Portland office relative to the early completion of the Prineville-Mitchell road. The people of the Prineville and Mitchell localities should congratulate themselves if funds become available for this road during the coming summer. On account of the extreme scarcity of labor, only roads of possible military importance are to be constructed from Federal funds during the period of the war.

A meeting of the users of the Maury Mt. unit of this Forest is to be held at Ammons sawmill on Apr. 4 for the purpose of cementing these permittees into a strong organization to better handle this unit of range. There are possibilities on this range that are to be found on few units. The area lies in a compact body and is remarkably well watered for this type of country. In addition, more than one-half of the Forest boundary is already fenced. By completing the fence and working out a proper salting scheme, it is believed this will become one of the most desirable pieces of summer range in the West.
