IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR CROOK COUNTY. In the Matter of the Organization of the Powell Butte Irrigation District. TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY COURT OF CROOK COUNTY, OREGON: Under and pursuant to Chapter 357 of the General Laws of Oregon, for 1917, the undersigned propose the formation and organization of Irrigation District to be known as the POWELL BUTTE IRRIGATION DISTRICT, for and including the lands hereinafter particularly described, and your petitioners respectfully request:

That they are each and all of them owners of land within said proposed irrigation district, which land is susceptible of irrigation being a majority of the owners of land irrigated or susceptible of irrigation therein.

That it is the purpose of your petitioners to organize an irrigation district within the boundaries of the lands hereinafter particularly described under and pursuant to Chapter 357 of the General Laws of Oregon for 1917, to provide for the construction of works for the irrigation of the same, or to provide for the reconstruction, betterment, extension, purchase, operation or maintenance of works already constructed, and for the assumption as principal or guarantor of indebtedness on account of district lands to the United States under the Federal reclamation laws, for the irrigation of said lands of petitioners and other lands within said proposed district, through the storage, diversion, purchase and use of the waters of Deschutes River.
