

NOTICE OF ELECTION OF POWELL BUTTE IRRIGATION DISTRICT.

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to an order of the County Court of Crook County, State of Oregon, made and entered on the 24th day of April, 1918, an election will be held on the 11th day of May, 1918, for the purpose of determining whether or not an irrigation district shall be organized under the provisions of Chapter 357 of the General Laws of Oregon for 1917; said irrigation district to be known as the Powell Butte Irrigation District, and the boundaries of said irrigation district as defined and established by the said order of the County Court of Crook County, Oregon, are described as follows:

Beginning in the center of the Channel of Crooked River where the same intersects the section line between sections 21 and 22, township 14 South, Range 14 East, Crook County, Oregon; thence south on said section line to the northeast corner of section 33 said township and range; thence west on the north line of said section 33 to the northwest corner of section 32; thence east to the southeast corner of section 32; thence north to the northeast corner of section 23; thence east to the northeast corner of section 34 said township and range; thence south on east line of said section 24 to south line of township 14 South, Range 14 East, Willamette Meridian; thence east on said township line to northwest corner of section 1, township 15 South, Range 14 East, Willamette Meridian; thence south along east line of said township to the quarter corner on the east line of section 24 of said township and range; thence west on the one-quarter line one-half mile to the center of section 24; thence south one-fourth mile; thence east on the sixteenth line to intersection with east line of section 24; thence south to southwest corner of section 19 of township 15 South, Range 15 East; thence east on south line of section 19 one-half mile to one-quarter corner; thence south one-half mile to center of section 30, thence west on the one-quarter line of section 30 to the center of section 26, township 15 South, and range 14 East; thence south to the one-quarter line of section 27 one-half mile; thence west on south line of section 26 to northwest corner of section 26 said township and range; thence south one-fourth mile to one-quarter corner of section 35; thence west one-fourth mile to southwest corner of NE 1/4 of NE 1/4, section 34 said township and range; thence south one-fourth mile to one-quarter line of section 24; thence west one-fourth mile to center of section 24; thence south one-fourth mile to southeast corner of NE 1/4 of SW 1/4, section 24; thence south one-half mile to southwest corner of NE 1/4 of SW 1/4, section 24; thence south one-fourth mile to south line of section 24; thence west on said south line of section 24 to northwest corner of section 4, township 15 South, Range 14 East, Willamette Meridian; thence south to one-quarter corner of section 3; thence west one-fourth mile on one-quarter line of section 4 said township and range to one-sixteenth line one mile to one-quarter line of section 9 said township and range, thence west one-fourth mile to center of Sec. 9; thence South 1/2 mile to south one-quarter corner, Sec. 9; thence west 1/2 mile; thence south 1/2 mile on one-sixteenth line of Sec. 16; thence west 1/2 mile to one-quarter corner on west line of sec. 16; thence south on said line to southwest corner section 28 said township and range; thence east on section line to southwest corner of section 27; thence east to one-quarter corner on south line of section 27; thence south to center of section 24 said township and range; thence east to one-quarter corner on east line of said section 24; thence south to southeast corner section 24; thence east along south township line of township 16 South, Range 14 East, Willamette Meridian to southeast corner of section 35, said township and range; thence north on said township line to northwest corner of section 1, township 16 South, Range 14 East; thence east on township line to a point where said township line intersects the center of the channel of Crooked River on the south line of section 36, township 15 South, Range 15 East; thence northerly along the center of the channel of Crooked River to a point where Crooked River intersects the south line of section 7, township 15 South, Range 15 East; thence west to southwest corner of section 7, said township and range; thence north on township line between ranges 15 and 16 to a point where said range line intersects Crooked River; thence in a northerly

and westerly direction along the center line of the channel of Crooked River to the point of beginning. Excepting therefrom the following described lands, to-wit: In Township 14 South, Range 15 East, Willamette Meridian: NW 1/4, NE 1/4, Sec. 29; NW 1/4, NW 1/4, Sec. 28; SW 1/4, NW 1/4, SW 1/4, Sec. 20; and all that part of the NW 1/4, SE 1/4, SW 1/4, Sec. 21, lying south of the center line of the channel of Crooked River; In Township 15 South, Range 14 East: SW 1/4, SE 1/4, Sec. 26; SE 1/4, SW 1/4, Sec. 26; all that portion of the NW 1/4, SE 1/4, Sec. 24, lying north and west of Central Oregon Irrigation Company's canal;

In Township 15 South, Range 15 East, Willamette Meridian: All of Section 6 and 18; NW 1/4, W 1/2 NE 1/4, SE 1/4, SW 1/4, Sec. 29; In Township 16 South, Range 14 East, Willamette Meridian: SW 1/4, Sec. 9; W 1/2 NW 1/4, Sec. 16; W 1/2 NW 1/4, and SW 1/4, Sec. 27; All being in Crook County, State of Oregon.

That said County Court in said order has determined that one election precinct is sufficient for the convenience of the electors in said proposed district, the boundaries of said election precinct being the same as the boundaries of said proposed irrigation district.

The polls at said election shall be opened at the hour of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and continue open until the hour of 8 o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, the date of said election, and otherwise said election shall be conducted as nearly as practicable in accordance with the general election laws of the State of Oregon.

The election in said proposed irrigation district shall cast ballots at said election which shall contain the words "Irrigation District-Yes", and "Irrigation District-No", or words equivalent thereto, and shall elect at large three directors for said district.

That said order of said court provides that the judges of said election shall be E. A. Russell, George Hobbs and Matt. Clabaugh, and the clerks for said election shall be L. L. Scott, Leland Casey and C. B. Quinn.

That the polling place in said election precinct for said district shall be the Edwards School House in school District No. 32, WITNESSED my hand and seal of the County Court of Crook County, State of Oregon, this 10th day of April, 1918.
