

JOURNAL GOES INTO \$2.00 CLASS JULY 1

The subscription price of the Crook County Journal will be advanced to \$2 per year on July 1.

This action has been forced because of the increased cost of materials since the war, and the Journal is one of the last papers in this part of the state to take this step, all Deschutes county and Jefferson county papers having increased their price months ago.

All renewals received up to July 1 will be taken at the old rate of \$1.50, and on the above date the subscription list will go on a positively cash in advance basis.

The new postage law which affects second class matter will take effect at that time, and makes a more strict handling of this branch of the business imperative.

It is not in any sense implied that the credit of the individual is not good for \$2.00, but the facts are that when a credit of \$2.00 each is

extended to a list of persons numbering well toward 2000, that a sum is involved which is too great for the average publisher to afford. The date of expiration of every subscription is printed on the copy of the paper going to that individual, in addition to which every subscriber will be mailed a statement of his account during the next few days.
