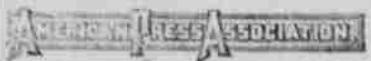

James Brickey, who was arrested on the high desert for the alleged theft of some cattle, was brought to Prineville, Friday.

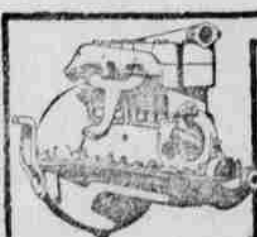
Mr. Brickey waived hearing and was released on bail. The date of his trial has not been set.
