PROCEEDINGS OF THE CROOK COUNTY COURT

that the tax collector proceed to sell all of said land and that notice of sale be given as provided by law. Bid of G. W. Lippincott to furnish 200 cords of wood to Crook County was rejected and Clerk was instructed to advertise for 180 cords, bids to be opened July 3rd, 1918.

In the matter of the application of Lavey Morgan for County aid. Application rejected and court ordered that the brothers of said Lavey Morgan shall each pay to her the sum of \$10.00 per month for her support.

In the matter of cancellation of County warrants issued more than seven years prior to July 1, 1918. County Clerk directed to publish list of warrants remaining in his office that were issued more than seven years prior to July 1, 1918. In case said warrants are not called for within 60 days from July 1st, the same will be cancelled in accordance with section 2893 Lord's Oregon Laws.

Clerk instructed to draw warrant in favor of J. E. Myers, chairman, for the sum of \$109.00 to be used for expenses for War Stamp Campaign.

Clerk instructed to draw warrant on the general fund for \$150.00 in favor of R. A. Ward, county agriculturist, to be used and expended by him for the destruction of rodent animals.

It appearing to the Court that Charles Pratt and Lettie Short have been duly convicted upon a plea in the Circuit Court for this County and that each of the aforesaid persons were sentenced by the Court to serve a sentence of six months in the county jail, and that they, and each of them, are county prisoners of Crook County, Oregon:

It is therefore ordered and adjudged, that the Sheriff of Crook County, Oregon, and he is hereby requested, to deliver to Mrs. Kate Warner the said Lettie Short and to Deputy Sheriff Ray Putnam the said Charles Pratt for employment upon public work now being performed by the said County of Crook, and under the supervision of this Court as provided by Chapter 3, Laws of Oregon for 1913, and

That the said Charles Pratt and Lettie Short have credit as provided by said Chapter 3, Laws of Oregon for 1913, for ten days each calendar month of their incarceration during their good behavior and diligent application to their work, and that this order be restrictive and apply from the date each began to serve his or her term as shown by the county jail record and as imposed by the Circuit Court.

In the matter of the employment of Marion Mayfield, a County prisoner. It appearing to the Court that one Marion Mayfield has been convicted of the crime of having intoxicating liquor in his possession and also of transporting intoxicating liquor, before the Hon. A. R. Bowman, Justice of the Peace in and for District No. 1, County of Crook and State of Oregon, and has been sentenced to serve 30 days in the county jail of Crook County;

Wherefore, it is hereby ordered and adjudged, that the Sheriff of Crook County, Oregon, be and he is hereby requested, to deliver to Ray Putnam the said Marion Mayfield for employment upon public work now being engaged in by the said County and under the supervision of the County Court of said Crook County, as provided by Chapter 3, Laws of Oregon, for 1913.
