Naturally, it will take time to adjust the motor works to its full accustomed activity.





MOVEMENT ON FOR RHINELAND REPUBLIC

Berlin.—The movement to withdraw from Germany and create a separate republic is gaining ground rapidly in the Rhineland, according to reports from Cologne to the Socialist Vorwaerts. The movement finds strong support on the part of the Clericals as a result of the Prussian government's announcement of its intention to disestablish the church.

Herr Theodore Wolff declares in the Tageblatt that all south Germany is dissatisfied with conditions in Barlin and is beginning to consider the question of leaving the capital to its fate. He points out that the reported aggression against the eastern border of Germany may have fatal consequences in regard to the provisioning of Berlin.
