GERMANS ACCEPT EXTENSION TERMS

Copenhagen.—The German government on Sunday night accepted the allied terms for the extension of the armistice, according to a dispatch to the Politiken from Weimar. The meeting at which the acceptance was decided upon, the Politiken's correspondent says, was attended by leaders of the various parties. Erzberger had been instructed from Berlin not to sign the document without obtaining authority from the government.

Replying to a request by Matthias Erzberger, head of the German armistice commission, for a delay in the signing of the armistice terms until Monday morning, Marshal Foch had declared that the armistice expired at 5 o'clock Monday morning and that the last hour for signing would be 6 o'clock Sunday afternoon, in order to be able to issue the necessary orders to the troops.

If not signed then, Marshal Foch said, he would be obliged to leave Tervet and the armistice would no longer be in force.

BRIEF GENERAL NEWS

The allies have taken steps to gain possession of one of the long-range guns which the Germans used to fire upon Paris.

The Philippines legislature just closed has passed an appropriation of 30,000,000 pesos to extend universal free education in the islands.

Drastic laws to check the spread of radical propaganda were advocated in the senate by Senators Thomas, of Colorado, and Weeks, of Massachusetts.

United States senators and congressmen, members of the two naval committees of congress, will come to the Pacific coast as guests of all the chambers of commerce, in March.

Direct appeal to President Wilson to settle the present strike of more than 32,000 metal trades workers in Seattle and Tacoma was said by shipyard strikers to be in contemplation by them.

Exclusive of expenditures by Belgium, Portugal, Roumania, Austria-Hungary and Bulgaria, the total cost of the European war was fixed at \$179,000,000,000 in an official estimate made public and based on data in the hands of the federal reserve board, the secretary of the territory and the bulletins of the Swiss Society of Banks.

Senate Bill Would Curb Reds.
Washington.—A measure designed to check radical agitation was introduced by Senator Jones, of Washington. It would punish persons who urged resistance to law or changes in the form of government with five years' imprisonment at hard labor or a fine of \$5000. Aliens convicted would be deported after serving sentences.

Price Adjustment Board is Approved.
Washington.—Approval of the proposal to establish a government price adjustment board to stabilize conditions during the post war period was cabled by President Wilson to Secretary Redfield.

President Wilson Salls for Home.
Brest.—President Wilson left Brest on his return to the United States on board the U. S. S. George Washington Saturday morning. The president will land at Boston February 25.

Wisconsin Women Get Vote.
Madison, Wis.—Wisconsin has granted women the right to vote at presidential elections. The senate, by a vote of 27 to 4, passed the house bill to this effect.
