NOTICE OF PROPOSED OPENING OF MAIN STREET

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council of the City of Prineville, Oregon, on the 7th day of January, 1919, directed the City Surveyor and engineer to make a survey and plat of the proposed opening, laying out and extending of Main Street in said City, and file the same with the City Recorder, which said survey and plat was duly made and filed with said City Recorder on the 23rd day of January, 1919, and thereafter, to-wit, on the 4th day of February, 1919, the City Council of said City after due consideration of said plat and survey, deemed it expedient and for the best interests of said City that certain portions of land described as follows:

COMMENCING on the south line of First Street of the Third Addition to the City of Prineville, Oregon, as the same is on file and record in the office of the County Clerk of said County, at a point thirty feet east from the east line of section 31, township 14 south, range 18 East, Willamette Meridian, Crook County, Oregon, thence west along said south line of section 31, a distance of sixty feet, thence south along a line parallel to and thirty feet westerly from the east line of said section 31, a distance of seven hundred forty-four and six-tenths (1144.6) feet to an intersection with the south city limits line, being on the east and west one-quarter line through the center of section 31, thence east along said south city limits line, a distance of thirty (30) feet to an intersection with the east line of said section 31, thence north along said east line of section 31, a distance of ten hundred thirty-two and six-tenths (1032.6) feet to an intersection with the south line of lot 8, block 8 of the Third Addition to said City, thence east along said south line of said lot 8, a distance of thirty (30) feet, thence north along a line parallel to and thirty feet westerly from the east line of said section 31, a distance of one hundred twelve (112) feet to the point of beginning; containing eighty-four hundredths (84) acres more or less; be vacated, laid out, and extended as a part and portion of Main Street of said City.

And all persons interested are further notified that the Council of said City will meet in regular session on the 1st day of April, 1919, at the hour of 8 o'clock, p. m., thereof, at which time said Council will hear objections, complaints for damages and remonstrances, if any there be, to said proposed improvement, and any person through or over whose land said proposed extension of Main Street shall be surveyed or platted as aforesaid, shall feel that he or she would be injured by the opening of the same, such person may make complaint thereof in writing to the Council at the time mentioned in this notice.

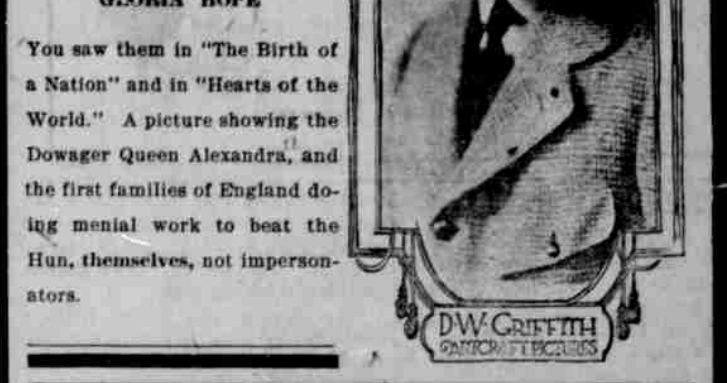
