The delegates who met at The Dalles on Saturday, from Wasco, Sherman, Jefferson, Deschutes and Klamath counties, to urge the early construction of The Dalles to California highway, were surprised and somewhat forestalled by Highway Commissioners Booth and Thompson, who announced that it had been decided to begin the work of construction this season and push it to completion as rapidly as possible.

Commissioner Booth said that the highway has already been located from Klamath Falls north to Sand Creek and that its location from the latter point to Warm Springs Indian reservation would be an easy matter. He announced that the department of Indian affairs and also the forest service have agreed to assist in the construction of the highway through the forest reserve and the Indian reservation.—Redmond Spokesman.
