RADICALS REPORTED TO CONTROL MUNICH

Bavarian Government Overthrown Following Shooting of Nine Officials.

LONDON.—The Bavarian government has been completely overthrown, according to dispatches from various sources. A soviet government was said to have been proclaimed in Munich by the workmen and soldiers' executive council. The three Socialist parties formed a coalition to administer the "proletariat dictatorship."

The shooting of nine government officials during a session of the Bavarian diet, which followed the assassination of Premier Eisner, apparently was the signal for the uprising in Munich.

A few hours later the city was in the hands of the radicals. Government troops offered only a feeble resistance. Business became paralyzed. Civilians began an exodus from the city. Mobs were reported parading the streets shouting, "Death to the bourgeoisie!"

The victims of the unidentified assassin in the diet chamber included:

Minister of the Interior Auer, Minister of War Rosshaupter, Minister of Justice Timm, Minister of Public Worship Hoffman, Minister of Communications Fraundorfer, Minister of Social Affairs Unterlienter, Councillor of the War Ministry Garres, Under Secretary for War Jahreis and Deputy Osel.

Auer and Osel were killed outright and Timm was said to have been fatally wounded. Rosshaupter was variously reported to have died of his wounds and to have been made prisoner by the Spartacans. The injuries of the others were said to have been less serious.

Count Arch-Valley, assassin of Eisner, died of bullet wounds inflicted by a guard, according to some dispatches. It was also reported that Deputy Autel, a Centrist, who had conducted a bitter campaign against Eisner in the newspapers, was shot by the premier's friends.

HINDENBURG PLANS DRIVE ON BOLSHEVIKI

Coblenz.—Field Marshal von Hindenburg is planning to use volunteer units in a drive against the bolsheviki, with Libau as the base of his operations, it is indicated by information which has reached American intelligence offices.

According to the American experts, who in the line of their duty are keeping in touch with the progress of the readjustment of the enemy's forces, German great headquarters seems to be following a policy of secrecy as regards the eastern front troop question.

This is believed to be due to the fact that the bolsheviki now have a normal military organization and so will be able to utilize any information they might obtain concerning their enemy.

The total number of volunteers on the eastern front or about to proceed there is estimated at nearly 100,000. Some of the old army troops are now on the eastern front.
