Threshing in February is something new for Wallowa county, but that is exactly what Arthur Hayes did on his ranch near Joseph. Mr. Hayes was unable to get a machine last fall and so had to wait until nearly spring to complete his harvest.—Joseph Herald.

The last monthly market day and public auction sale to be held in Vale this spring has been definitely scheduled for Saturday, April 19. The committee reports more enthusiasm over the coming sale than for any of the former ones. Already several good listings have been made with C. C. Mueller and C. G. Griffith, including 30 head of cattle, a good wagon, 4 head of milch cows, several plows, etc.—Malheur Enterprise.

That the Deschutes National Forest has been given control of all sheep from this side of the mountains on the Santiam and Cascade National Forests was the report this morning of Supervisor N. G. Jacobson, on his return to Bend from a business trip to Portland. The new ruling will mean some 60,000 head of sheep added to the number already under Deschutes Forest supervision or a total of about 100,000.—Bend Bulletin.

Three hundred and twelve dollars was in the big nugget that was shown in Canyon a few days ago. It weighed 19 ounces. It was pure gold with no quartz whatever. It was found by Fred Barnhard and Alf Gentry at Marysville, about two miles east of Canyon. It is one of the largest nuggets seen here since early days. The boys were doing a little placer mining and this chunk was washed off the surface of the ground.—Blue Mountain Eagle.

In a letter received from Irvin S. Cobb, the noted lecturer and author, from New York, he advises that he has made definite plans for a hunting trip through Central Oregon early in October, with A. Whisman, editor of the Press and Norman G. Jacobson, supervisor of the Deschutes National Forest. While in Bend in February, Mr. Cobb was attracted by the advantages offered by this section for an outing trip on his return from Europe, where he will go in a few weeks in the interest of a new series of articles in the Saturday Evening Post. On his return to the United States he will likely "do" the west for the same publication and his trip to Bend and Central Oregon will be among the first visits made. It is his intention to spend the latter part of September hunting in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, from where he will come directly to Bend. The trip planned consists of a visit to Klamath and Lake counties, to Crater lake and a cougar hunt in western Douglas county to north of Crater lake.—Bend Press.
