BRIEF GENERAL NEWS

Official announcement is made that the United States postal censorship has been discontinued.

According to Le Journal of Paris, more than 5000 American soldiers have married French girls.

Governor Frank O. Lowden's candidacy for the republican nomination for president has been launched at Chicago.

Sonator Myers of Montana has presented a bill to prohibit all immigration for 20 years and that from Germany, Austria-Hungary, Bulgaria and Turkey for 50 years.

Secretary Baker has authorized recruiting of 26,740 men for service on the Mexican border. They will replace men enlisted for the war emergency and now eligible for discharge.

Portland, Oakland and Santa Barbara and the state of Washington won the four captured German cannon for largest Victory loan over-subscriptions, the federal reserve bank's final statement of the campaign shows.

The district court at Fairmont, Minn., has refused to postpone the cases of A. C. Townley and Joseph Gilbert, president and organizer of the non-partisan league, charged with conspiracy to violate the state disloyalty law.

Gustav Adolf Bauer, who succeeds Philipp Scheidemann as German premier, is second chairman of the general commission of the federation of labor unions. He was elected to the reichstag in 1912 from Breslau and appointed minister of labor under Prince Max last October. He is an authority on labor legislation and workers' insurance.
