Under the supervision of E. D. Gilson many entries have been received for the big street parade to be held in the morning in which business, social, civic, fraternal organizations, labor societies and churches will participate. More than \$300 is to be given in prizes. Agricultural organizations in other localities will participate for liberal cash prizes.

Hon. B. F. Mulkey of Portland, considered to be one of the best known speakers in Oregon will deliver the address of the day. A program has been provided in addition. The music for the day will be given by the Bend-Prineville Band.

Of interest to the Central Oregon Anglers a fly casting contest will be held in the afternoon at which all the artists with the fly rod will test their skill for liberal prizes.

Men, women and children will be given an opportunity to test their prowess in sports to be held on the streets. More than \$200 in cash prizes have been offered.

In the afternoon Bend will meet the crack team of Battery A 147 Field Artillery, which has made a big record over seas.

One of the crowning events of the day will be the two ten round boxing matches, one between Fred Gilbert of Bend and fast Sailor Chas. Fox. Both men are now in training for the match. Knowlton and Byers, two fast lads of Portland are booked for ten rounds. Both men have a go getter reputation on the coast. One fast preliminary will also be staged. Bend promises fun for everybody on the Fourth of July.
