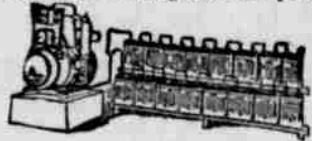

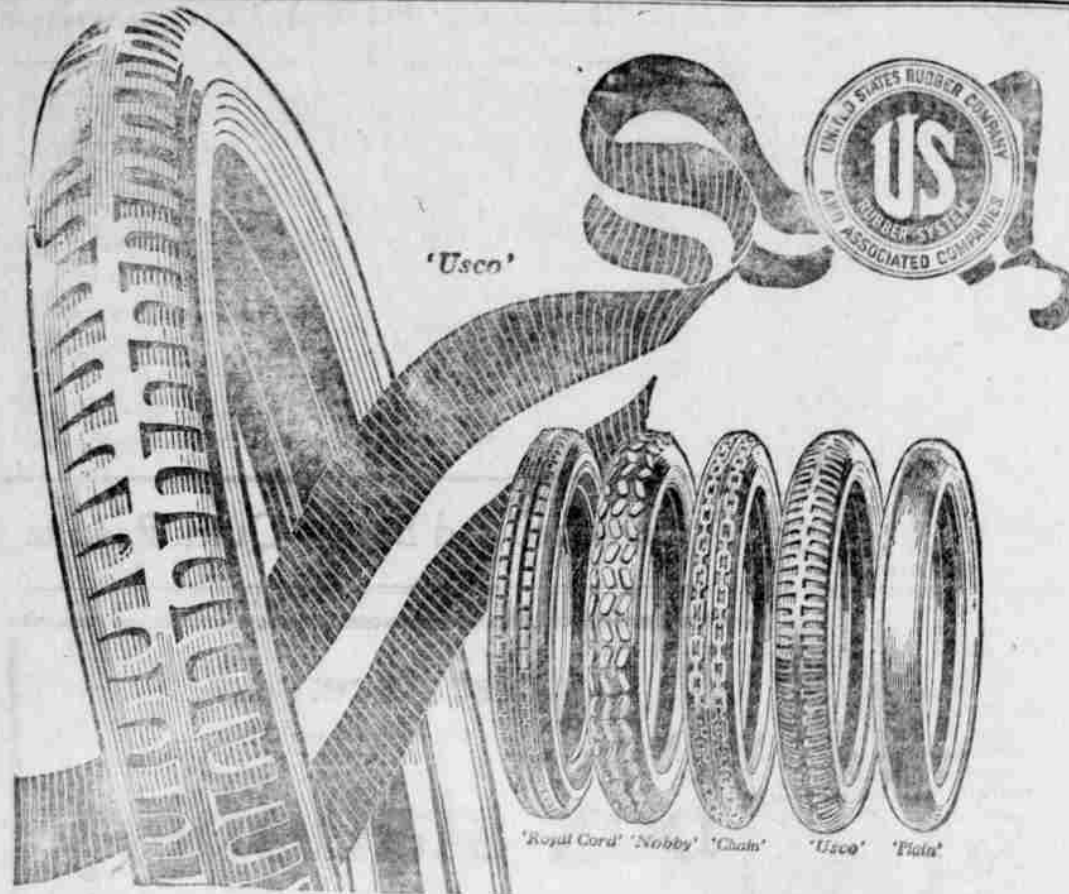

ORDINANCE NO. 247

An Ordinance vacating Sixth street between the west line of Main or A street and the east line of B street in the city of Prineville, Crook county, Oregon.

WHEREAS in compliance with the provisions of Section thirty-nine (39) of Chapter seven (7) of the Charter of the City of Prineville, Oregon, a petition containing the names of more than ten freeholders has been filed with the City Council of said City praying that Sixth street between the west line of Main or A street and the east line of B street in said City be closed and vacated, said petition being filed with the City Recorder and presented to the City Council on June 3, 1919; and

WHEREAS, no objection or remonstrance against the granting of said petition has been made, the City Council of said City deems it expedient and for the best interests of the said city to grant the prayer of the said petitioners and vacate the said street as indicated herein in said City;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the people of the City of Prineville, Oregon as follows:

Section 1. That all that part and portion of Sixth street between the west line of Main or A street and the east line of B street in the City of Prineville, Crook county, Oregon, in the second Addition to Prineville, according to the duly recorded plat thereof, be and the same is hereby closed and vacated, and said portion and part of said Sixth street herein vacated is hereby granted and conveyed to the owner or owners of the adjoining lots, tracts or parcels of land as their several interests may appear on record in the office of the County Clerk of Crook county, State of Oregon, at the time of the passage of this ordinance.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after the 12th day of September, 1919.
