Word came in a letter received by Riley Cook from Miles W. Bennett of Walla Walla, that a large portion of his wheat was destroyed when smut caused the threshing machine to explode. 2,500 sacks of threshed wheat and 25 acres of standing grain were destroyed. 1,000 sacks of the threshed grain and the buildings were saved. There was an insurance on the destroyed property for 35 bushels per acre. However, the standing grain that was burned was going 40 bushels to the acre. Mr. Bennett was formerly a Madras resident, leaving here five years ago.—Madras Pioneer.

Sealed proposals will be received by the Board of Directors of the Ochoce Irrigation District at its office in Prineville, Oregon, for the purchase of \$150,000.00 of Bonds of said District until the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on the 26th day of September, 1910, which said issue of bonds will bear date of October 1, 1910 and bear interest at not to exceed 6 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of January and July in each year, principal and interest payable at the office of the County Treasurer of Crook County, Oregon or at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City at the option of the purchaser; said bonds being in the denomination of \$1,000.00 and \$500.00 each and maturing approximately as follows:

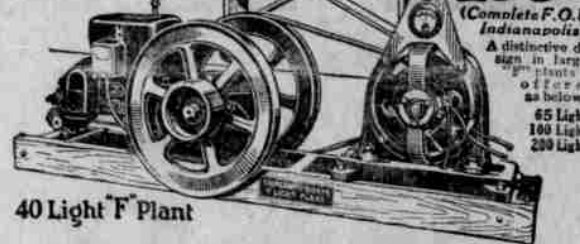
