Original "Lone Tree." There was an immense cottonwood,
four feet thick and very tall, whick
stood in Nebraska almost in the ceastoon
ter of the continent, hair way betwema
New York and San Francisco, which New York and San fruncisco, whica
was within one mile of that center.
Under its branches rested thousands of 43 ers en route to the Eldorado of
the Pacifc coast. It was the best-
known camping ground on the old
California trafl. From 1849. wheu the
 plains down to the completion of the
Unlon Pacelfe railway, the great tree
was a guidepost to the wagon tratna
woing west. going west.
Atter the ratiway was completed
