NOTICE OF ELECTION

NOTICE is hereby given that pursuant to an order this day made by the County Court of the County of Crook and State of Oregon an election will be held on November 22, 1919, by the electors of the proposed Lone Pine Irrigation District. The name of the District, if organized, shall be the Lone Pine Irrigation District, and its boundaries shall be as follows: Beginning at the Northeast corner of Section four (4), Township fourteen (14) South, Range fourteen (14) East of the Willamette Meridian and running thence South one mile to the Southeast corner of said Section four (4); thence West one quarter of a mile to the Southwest corner of said Section four (4); thence South one quarter of a mile to the Southeast corner of the Northwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section nine (9), said Township and range; thence West one quarter of a mile to the Southwest corner of said Northwest quarter of said Section nine (9); thence North one quarter of a mile to the Northwest corner of the Northwest quarter of Section nine (9); thence West one half mile to the Northeast corner of Section eight (8), said Township and Range; thence South one mile to the Southeast corner of said Section eight (8); thence North one quarter of a mile to the Northwest corner of said Section eight (8); thence East one quarter of a mile to the Southwest corner of the Southwest quarter of said Section five (5); thence Township and Range; thence North one half mile to the Northwest corner of the Northwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of said Section five (5); thence East one quarter of a mile to the center of said Section five (5); thence North to the Northwest corner of the Northwest quarter of Section five (5); thence East one and one half miles on the Township line to the place of beginning. Also beginning at the Northeast corner of Section sixteen (16), Township fourteen (14) South, Range fourteen (14) East of the Willamette Meridian and running thence East one quarter of a mile to the Northeast corner of the Northwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of said Section sixteen (16); thence South three quarters of a mile to the place of beginning. Also beginning at the Northeast corner of Section sixteen (16), Township fourteen (14) South, Range fourteen (14) East of the Willamette Meridian and running thence South one

quarter of a mile to the Southeast corner of the Northwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of said Section sixteen (16); thence West one mile, more or less, to the Southwest corner of Lot number one (1), said Section sixteen (16); thence North one quarter of a mile to the Northwest corner of said Section sixteen (16); thence East one mile, more or less, to the place of beginning. Also beginning at the Northeast corner of the Northwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section twenty (20), Township fourteen (14) South, Range fourteen (14) East of the Willamette Meridian and running thence South one half of a mile to the Southeast corner of the Southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of said Section twenty (20); thence West one half mile to the Southwest corner of the Northwest quarter of said Section twenty (20); thence North one half mile to the Northwest quarter of said Section twenty (20); thence East one half mile to the place of beginning. The polling place for said election shall be at the school house located within the boundaries of the said proposed District and the polls shall be open on said day from the hour of 8 o'clock in the forenoon until 5 o'clock in the afternoon. Said election shall be for the purpose of determining whether or not said Lone Pine Irrigation District as described herein shall be organized under the provisions of Chapter 357 General Laws of Oregon for 1917, and all acts supplemental thereto and amendatory thereof; which question will be submitted in the following manner: 12 IRRIGATION DISTRICT—YES 13 IRRIGATION DISTRICT—NO Three (3) Directors for the District shall be elected from the District at large, at the said election.
