**ALLIES MAY ACCEPT U. S. RESERVATIONS**

London.—Allied representatives in conference here have decided definitely to let Russia settle its own difficulties, it was learned authoritatively.

The conference, in which Premier Lloyd George, Premier Clemenceau, Foreign Minister Scialoja and American Ambassador Davis participated, was said to have determined not to deal with the Bolsheviks, and at the same time to refuse further aid to General Deniken and Admiral Kolchak, anti-Bolshevik leaders.

The outstanding result of the conference of the "big three" here is that Great Britain, France and Italy are showing an inclination to accept "reasonable" reservations to the peace treaty by the American senate, according to opinion expressed in official circles.

One official said that "as the price for American aid" he believed "the allies are prepared to swallow most of the senate's reservations, providing it can be arranged."

"European statesmen," he continued, "are realizing what American isolation will mean and they are fast embracing the idea it is possible to meet the senate at least half way to enable ratification of the treaty. If the senate understood this it might relax its attitude somewhat."

**BRIEF GENERAL NEWS**

Production of coal in the bituminous fields is gradually creeping toward the peak, according to reports.

Federal Fuel Administrator Garfield resigned because he disagreed in principle with the coal strike settlement.

Senator Lodge, in a speech in the senate, declared the peace treaty "dead" until again submitted by the president.

Hope of enacting railroad legislation by January 1, the date on which the roads are to be turned back to private control, has been virtually abandoned by senate leaders.

Enver Pasha, the former Turkish minister of war, has been crowned king of Kurdistan, the Turkish region lying between Mesopotamia and Persia, according to reports.

The nomination of Representative Alexander, democrat, Missouri, to be secretary of commerce to succeed William C. Redfield, who recently resigned, was confirmed by the senate.

Among bills to be introduced at a special session of the Kansas legislature is one creating an industrial court to settle labor disputes and making illegal strikes or lockouts in certain essential industries.

**Conservative Labor Wins**  
 Washington.—More than 200 labor leaders from all parts of the United States formally ratified a new "declaration of independence" written by the executive committee of the American Federation of Labor, urging resistance to "government by injunction." It also read the Bolsheviks and I. W. W. out of the ranks of organized labor.

**Clemenceau Hurt By Fall**  
 Paris.—It developed with Premier Clemenceau's return from the conference in London that he had suffered a fracture of a rib on his trip to England through a fall on board the destroyer in which he crossed the channel northward.


**Juneau, Alaska, Rocked by Quake.**
