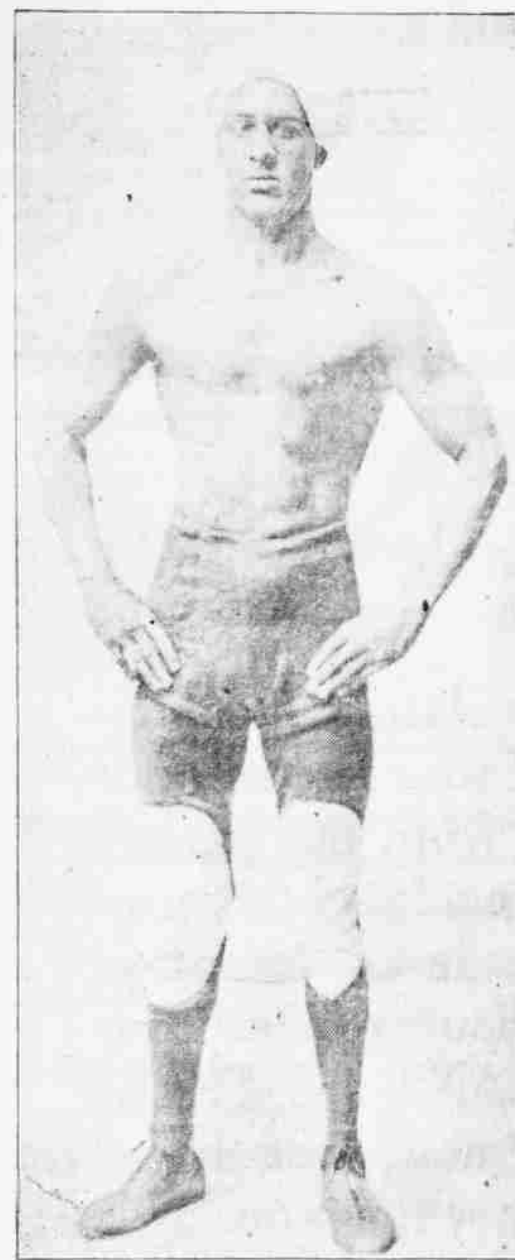
BARNES ITEMS
