Castor Oil for Botulism.
In a case of botulism—poisoning from eating spoiled vegetables or fruit and most common with canned goods—the most effective remedy is a generous dose of castor oil. But it must be given quickly, as one of the effects of the poisoning is to paralyze the intestines, and when this has taken place the oil will do no good.

Floor 160 years Old Still Good.
When an old house in Pike county, Pennsylvania, was torn down it was found the floors of pitch pine, 160 years old, were still good, says the American Forestry Magazine of Washington. The size amazed the carpenters, for the planks were two feet wide and an inch and a quarter thick.

Quebracho Bark Valuable.
Quebracho bark, one of the chief exports of the Argentine, will tan leather at least three times as fast as the bark of the oak or the hemlock, and in less than ten years fortunes have been made by investing in quebracho lands. Nearly 1,000,000 tons of the wood or the dry extract, are sent to the United States and Europe annually. The growth of the tree is of the slowest, and it is estimated that 1,000 years is required for it to reach maturity.

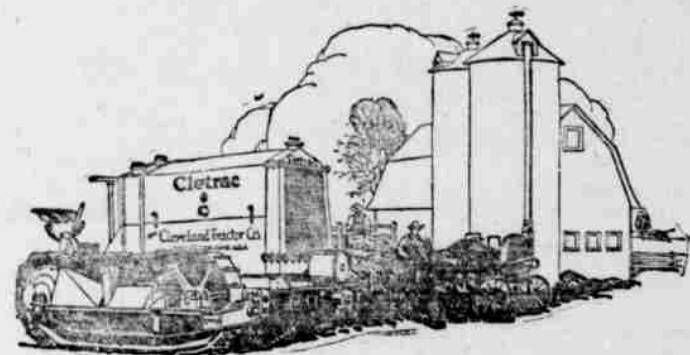
One of the Family.
