K. D. Huston returned to Prineville Sunday, accompanied by Eleanor Hackleman and F. C. Logan.

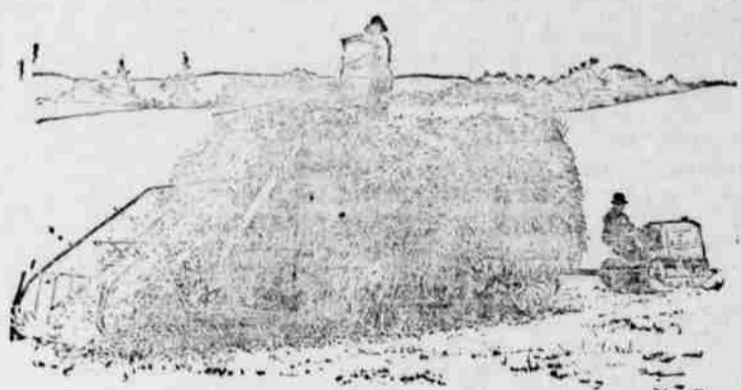
Lem Huston and Harry Hackleman moved a bunch of cattle to the Barbwire ranch Saturday.
