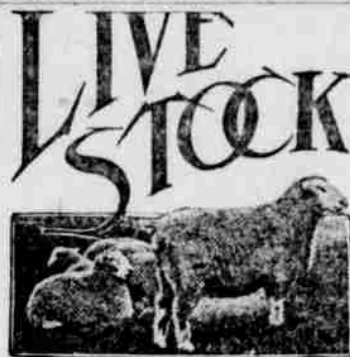

GOOD RECORD IN "T B" DRIVE

Official Tuberculin Testing in October, 1919, Greater Than Any Previous Month.

More official tuberculin testing of cattle was conducted during October, 1919, than in any previous month of any year, according to a summary just issued by the bureau of animal industry, United States department of agriculture. During the month 57,270 cattle were tested by state and federal veterinarians engaged in co-operative tuberculosis-eradication work. Herds or lots tested numbered 3,251, and the total number of reactors found was 2,821, an average of slightly less than one reactor for each.

From the standpoint of the number of animals tested the drive against tuberculosis was most vigorous in Minnesota, where 6,269 cattle underwent the test. Vermont was second with 4,035 and Washington third with 3,855 cattle tested.

The figures, live stock specialists of the department point out, indicate the nation-wide extent of the campaign to stamp out the disease. At the end of October the total number of herds officially accredited as free from tuberculosis after a number of tests was 1,324, more than double the number at the beginning of the year.

LIVE STOCK NOTES

Breeding hogs should have lots of exercise.

With the present high prices of feeds and the good prices being paid for hogs, no farmer can afford to neglect his pig crop.

Animals should be sheltered in wet weather. On cold days they will do better if confined in the barn than if turned on pasture.

Manufacture of sorghum in Marion county as a means of beating the high cost of sugar is advocated by C. I. Lewis, manager of the Oregon Growers Co-operative association. Mr. Lewis says sorghum has been manufactured in the Lebanon district and some other sections of the state for many years and has proved profitable to the promoters of the industry.

There were four deaths due to industrial accidents in Oregon during the week ending May 6, according to a report prepared by the state industrial accident commission. The victims were L. A. Freeman, bucker, Eagle Creek; Marion Bigham, sawyer, Bush; Frank Lewis, deck hand, Bandon, and Lee Hollenbeck, deck hand, Bandon. A total of 498 accidents were reported.

A. Phillip Connally, member of a well-known Union county family, according to Mrs. Cella George, his housekeeper, committed suicide by shooting himself through the heart at his farm home, eight miles from La Grande. The reported suicide was committed while Connally was making preparations to pay \$12,500 damages won by his housekeeper in a breach of promise action.

Oregon will not get any captured German field guns or other confiscated war equipment until congress passes an act providing for the distribution of this class of material, according to a telegram received at the executive offices from P. C. Harris of the adjutant-general's office at Washington. One bill is now before congress, however, which, if passed, will allow Oregon a number of guns of 77 caliber and above.

Between April 1, 1917, when the state highway commission had its inception, and April 30, 1920, there was laid in Oregon approximately 430 miles of paving, 448 miles of macadam and grading, totalling 288 miles, according to a report prepared by the highway department. The total estimated cost of these improvements was \$25,312,759.46, of which the state paid \$18,011,058.55. Contributions of counties amounted to \$3,634,595.10, while the government's share of the total expense was \$3,667,105.81.

Oregon leads the seven states included in the 12th reserve district in the purchase of thrift and war savings stamps, according to a report received by J. A. Churchill, thrift director for the state, from the regional director's headquarters in San Francisco.

J. W. Church, chief grain inspector for the Oregon public service commission, with headquarters in Portland, has been assigned by the commission to go to San Francisco, where he will attend the meeting of the foreign commerce association of the Pacific coast.

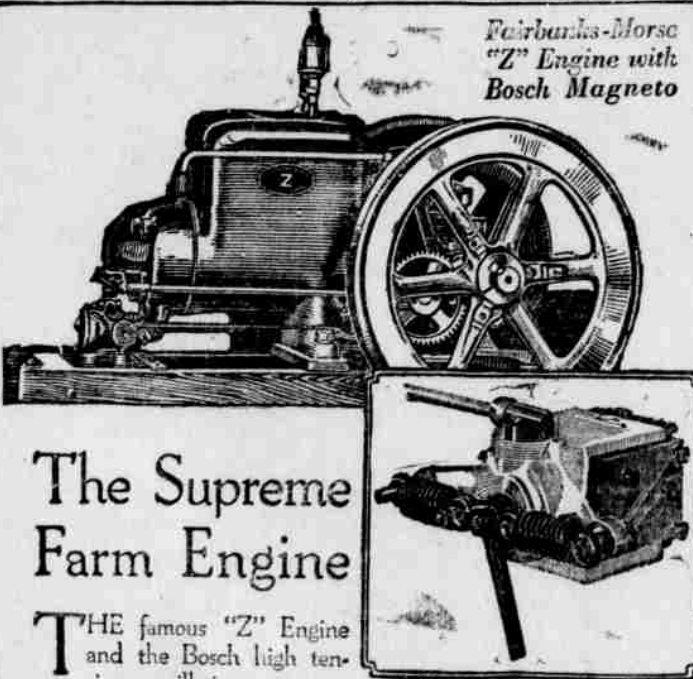
