The present cost at the State University is \$203 a year; at the College it is \$180. But even before the war, when money would buy twice as much as it buys now, the aver-age cost at all other state institutions was \$325 a year. In additi-

THEIR BUILDING INVEST-MENT IS ALSO VERY LOW

At the State University it is at present \$322 per student; at the College, \$300. But in state institutions elsewhere, statistics show the average to be \$995. These are convincing proofs of econom-ical administration, but the three institutions can no longer give sat-isfactory training to the vast num. ber of Oregon Boys and Girls (5,400 in full time courses alone.) unless they receive more support. On May 21 the Higher Educational relief measure will appear on the ballot. You are urged to preserve the quality of higher education by voting for it.
