PLAN TREATMENT OF LAMBS

Attention Attracted in Many Localities to Value of Docking and Castrating Lambs.

The value of castration and docking of buck lambs destined for market is attracting attention in many localities where the practice has not been generally followed. In Braxton county, W. Va., for example, the farm bureau plans a demonstration of the value of castration and docking by sending to market one carload of buck lambs that have not been thus treated, and at the same time a carload of buck lambs that have been docked and castrated. The prices will be compared, and a forceful object lesson is expected. Farmers in Glimmer county, of the same state, expect to dock and castrate all their buck lambs in the coming year.

Failure to follow this practice generally is regarded by officials of the Bureau of Animal Industry, United States department of agriculture, as a weak point in agriculture, and they recommend the practice to all farmers.

Docking gives the lambs a neater and more uniform appearance. Long-tailed lambs collect dung, which often causes maggot trouble during hot weather.

URGES WAR ON RATS

Surgeon-General Warns Danger of Bubonic Plague.

Washington.—Calling attention to the discovery of bubonic plague in several American and Mexican gulf ports and renewing his warning regarding the introduction of the plague from Mediterranean ports which are known to be infected, Surgeon-General Hugh S. Cumming urged communities throughout the country and especially along the coast, to inaugurate rat extermination campaigns.

"The extermination of rats also is to be desired because of the tremendous economic damage they cause," said General Cumming.

According to conservative estimates by the public health service based on numerous surveys, there is at least one rat for every person in the United States. The same authorities say it costs the United States \$180,000,000 a year to support its rat population.

Kansas Fighting the I. W. W.
Topeka, Kan.—Charging that the I. W. W. advocates acts in violation of the Kansas anti-syndicalism law, an injunction suit was filed in the district court at Eldorado, asking that the I. W. W. be enjoined permanently from maintaining an organization in Kansas.

Colby Floor Leader.

San Francisco, Cal.—Bainbridge Colby, secretary of state, has been elected as floor leader for the administration forces at the democratic convention. He sits as a delegate from the District of Columbia and comes as one of President Wilson's spokesmen.

IMPROVE QUALITY OF STOCK

Tennessee Department of Agriculture Urges Breeders to Join Better Sires Crusade.

"Better sires—better stock."
"A nation-wide crusade to improve the quality of cattle, horses, mules, swine, sheep, goats, and poultry in the United States."

"Every Tennesseean who believes in better live stock should join this movement, begun by the United States department of agriculture."

That is the first thing seen by the readers of the current issue of the Monthly Bulletin of the Tennessee department of agriculture.

"It means the passing of the scrub," the Bulletin continues.

"It means greater success in live-stock production and consequently greater prosperity for the people."

"Good-bred stock will outsell the scrub every time."

"If you want better stock consult the county agent in your own county or else write to the division of extension, Knoxville, Tenn."

"Now is the time to put Tennessee on the live-stock map."

"If you believe in better live stock and poultry join this movement. Tennessee has natural advantages for wonderful live-stock development, but the 'better sires' crusade will do much to hurry along this development."

BEEF PRODUCED FOR FAMILY

More Is Bought From Village Butcher Than Is Raised on Farm—Little Veal Killed.

The farmer buys more beef than he takes from the farm. Only about 10 per cent of meat furnished by the average farm is beef. In the north and west the average consumption of beef per family is nearly 300 pounds and in the south it is less than 100 pounds, according to the United States department of agriculture.

The beef animal killed for home use may be a beef steer or an unprofitable cow, or a heifer that does not promise to be a good producer and would not bring a good price for beef on the market. Very little veal

is killed on the farm for home use. Much of the beef bought by farmers is bought in the summer from village butchers who operate meat wagons or cars in the country. On the average farm there are no facilities for keeping fresh meat during warm weather.

SAYS ALL FILIPINOS WANT INDEPENDENCE.

"It is frequently said that only the politicians in the Philippines want independence, but I do not think such is the case," said Dr. D. M. Gaudier, superintendent of the California Anti-Saloon League, who has just returned from the Philippines. "I have met all classes of people from various parts of the islands and all alike seem to me to desire independence. I am inclined to think that they have the ability to govern themselves. We are developing a social and political conscience in America and they will develop one there; and I very much doubt that they will learn as fast under present conditions as they would under complete independence. Independence in some form is bound to come and I am inclined to think that it had better come soon."

Japan Will Give Korea Legislature.
Honolulu.—As a preliminary step toward granting Korea self-government and the right to elect representatives to the Japanese diet, the Japanese government has decided to create legislative assemblies in the Korean province to which only Koreans can be elected, according to a Tokio cable received here.

Allied Nations Masters, States Foch.
Paris.—Allied nations are masters of the situation in the near east as elsewhere, and, if in complete harmony, can employ all the forces at their disposal to carry out their policies which are "soberly proportioned to their interests," said Marshal Foch in an interview.

Baker Heads Water Power Board.
Washington.—Secretary Baker was named by President Wilson to be chairman of the board provided for in the water power bill to carry out the provisions of that measure. Secretaries Meredith and Payne were named at the same time to be members of the board.
