Tests of a Good Thermometer.
In order to ascertain whether a
thermometer is correct or not, it is
first plunged into melting ice and then
into boiling water; the level of the
mercury should indicate upon the
scale exactly 32 degrees and 212 de-
grees Fahrenheit. When inverted the
mercury should fall with a sudden
click and fill the tube, thus showing
the perfect exclusion of air.
