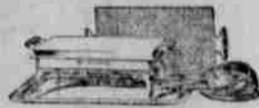

**Rats Cause Loss to Cane Growers.**  
Cane growers in Porto Rico estimate their annual loss at \$75,000, due not only to the cane actually destroyed but also to the fermentation set up in the cane juices in the stalks that had been gnawed upon, thus reducing the purity and the sucrose content. The loss was based upon the estimate that only one-half of 1 per cent of stalks were attacked by rats, but in 17 to 20 instances the estimates made of different plantations varied from 1 per cent to 1 per cent of stalks attacked.

**The Camel's Foot.**  
The camel's foot is like a soft cushion, peculiarly well adapted to the gravel and stones over which it is constantly walking. During a single journey through the Sahara, horses have worn out three sets of shoes while the camel's feet were not even sore.

**Hundred Species of Petrels.**  
Scattered over widespread areas of the ocean are more than 100 species of petrels, but among the most interesting are the fulmars. Sailors of British vessels commonly refer to them as "mollymawks," a corruption of malmouk. The birds in great flocks follow in the wake of ships, and are especially fond of whaling vessels, for they like the substance that is thrown out in the refuse from whale cleaning. The fulmar ranges over the North Atlantic from 45 degrees latitude on the American side, and lower, to 53 degrees as the furthest south, on the European side.

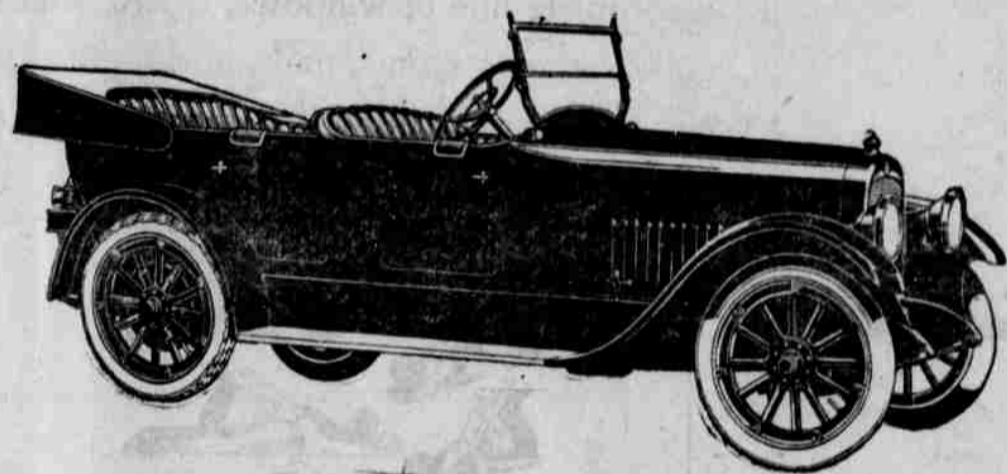
**Within the Law.**
