

FROM THE PETALS OF ROSES

Most Highly-Prized Scent is Volatile Oil, the Product of the Queen of Flowers.

Attar of roses, or otto of roses, is a volatile oil of the petals of some species of rose. It is a nearly colorless or light yellow crystalline solid at temperatures below 80 degrees Fahrenheit, becoming a little above that temperature. It is imported from the East, where, in Syria, Persia, India, as well as in Turkey and Bulgaria, roses are cultivated to a considerable extent for the attar. To procure the attar the rose petals usually are distilled with about twice their weight of water, and the distillate is exposed to the cool night air in open vessels, from which the thin film of attar is skimmed with a feather in the morning. Attar is said to have been obtained first by an accidental distillation, rose petals having been exposed with water to the heat of the sun, and to have been found floating on the surface of the water. Egypt to Have Finest Hospital. The Egyptian government has decided to build what is officially described as "the finest and most complete medical school and hospital in the world," in Cairo. It is to contain 1,225 beds, and will have accommodation for 3,000 out-patients a day. 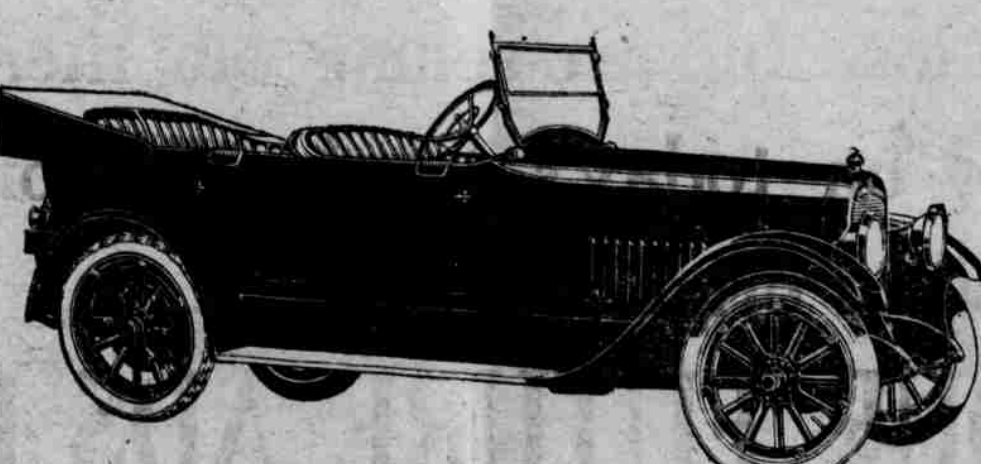
