Learning an Anthem.

A choir leader says: "In beginning the study of a new anthem I find it a good plan to go right through the whole piece at the first attempt to get the general outline and the spirit of it. At the first reading I pass by all mistakes such as false notes, wrong time, improper phrasing, etc. In some works it pays to run through the whole anthem this way two or three times that the piece may be grasped sufficiently to enable the singers to study the details with more intelligent relation to the whole."

Liquid Soap for Cleaning Carpet.

Take two bars of white soap chopped fine and melted in one quart of hot water. When almost cold, add a teaspoonful of ammonia. When ready to wash or scrub the carpet, put a little ether into the mixture. Keep it well corked and add half a cupful of the mixture to a large pailful of tepid water. It makes a powerful lather. Wipe the carpet off with clear water.

Omnivorous Codfish.

That the codfish is omnivorous is shown by the fact that, in addition to the crustaceans, small fish and sea moss which it eats, all sorts of things have been found in its stomach, such as small scissors, corn-cobs, rubber dolls and pieces of clothing.

Mixture That Makes for Success
Color Blindness.
No fewer than 55 persons in every thousand are more or less color-blind. The commonest form is not, as many suppose, inability to distinguish red and green—that affects one person in 55. The most usual symptom is uncertainty between blue and green. This is experienced by one out of every 46 persons, but only one in 60 is unable to distinguish between brown and green. Color blindness is more common among educated than uneducated people, and an odd fact is that musicians are more liable to this affliction than are any other class or profession.

Earthquakes at Sea.

An eruption occurring at sea is called a seaquake and the chief effect is the production of huge waves and violent commotion of the water of the sea. In 1854, during an earthquake at Sicoda, Japan, the waters of a bay were first agitated, then retreated, leaving the bottom bare in places where the water had been 30 feet deep. A wave 30 feet high then rushed in and swept everything in its path. Other earthquake waves have destroyed cities and shipping; part of the destruction in the Messina earthquake was caused by a wave produced in this way.

Plants in Bedroom.

Do not have flowers or plants in the bedroom, particularly overnight. Poisonous gas is evolved from the colored parts of flowers both by night and day, and from the green parts in addition at night. It is pleasant to have flowers in a guestroom, but for the reason just set forth they should not remain in the sleeping chamber. The way to get around the difficulty is by the use of a window box.
