

At a meeting of the people from various parts of the county Monday evening at the court house, the proposed constitution of the Crook Co... Chamber of Commerce was submitted, read and referred to the people of Powell Butte and the Ochoco Farmers organization for final ratification.

The matter will be presented to the people of Powell Butte tonight, and the Ochoco Farmers on Monday night, and a meeting of the people from all parts of the county held at the circuit court room on Tuesday night of next week for final ratification, and the election of the board of directors.

A goodly number of men attended the Monday night meeting, and every man present signed the membeship list of the county chamber, which will be submitted to the communities mentioned above before final organization is completed.

As a feature of the organization Cap Fuller introduced his plan for the Crook County Irrigators, a club with the one purpose of advertising the county and promoting good will among the communities and the peaple of the county in general.

It is planned to attend the varlous conventions and other meetings in a body, to go in uniform, perhaps overalls and packing an irrigators shovel, and march in the rose festival parade in Portland and other meetings.

An idea of the plans for the organization may be gleaned from the pledge which has already been signed by some 200 men, and which is ready for you to sign.
