Show the Right Spirit.

Judge Hanks says that the people of St. Johns are to be complimented for the manner in which they obey the new ordinance regarding the keeping up of live stock. There have been but three cows impounded since the ordinance went into effect the first of the month.

Two cows belonging to J. H. Crook and one belonging to Bert Edwards are the only ones that have been impounded and the owners came around and paid, without a murmur, the little two dollars to get them out.

A large number of people have paid dog tax, which is one dollar for males and two dollars for females.

It is a satisfaction to the officials to see the spirit which the citizens of St. Johns manifest in this matter; and there is no reason why any other spirit should be shown, for a law is a law and should be respected as such.

When an animal is impounded a fee of two dollars is charged and fifty cents a day for feeding and watering is added.

Review Doing Good Work.
